

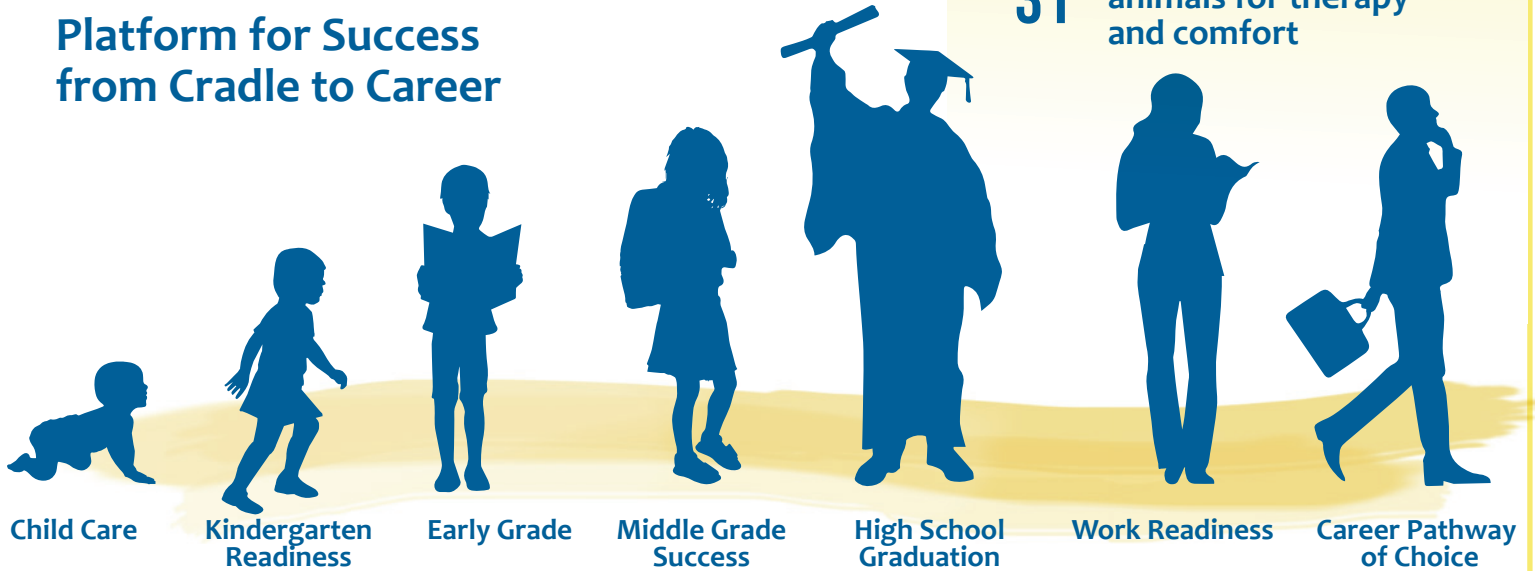


HELPING CHILDREN SUCCEED

Day Treatment

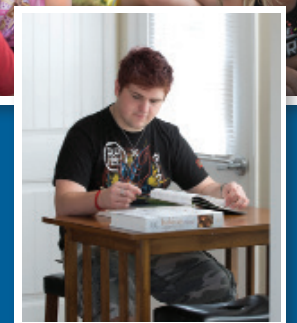
Children attend school at Eliada instead of public school to better meet their special learning needs.
